


#### Stereotypes

- Older adults:
  - Are unattractive and sexually undesirable

  - Prevention of healthy sexuality











Sexual Activity with a Partner in Previous 12 Months




#### Vaginal Intercourse (usually or always)






Oral Sex


#### Barriers to Sexual Activity

- Interest?






#### Barriers to Sexual Activity

- Men
  - Physical health



Men's physical health status is probably more responsible for any decline in sexual activity for older couples.

#### And bodies change...



30% lower risk of ED if.... you take care of yourself!

#### **Changing Bodies**

#### Men

- Longer/more stimulation to achieve erection
- Erections may not be as firm
- Erections may be lost before climaxing
- Prolonged intercourse/stimulation to achieve climax
- Climax may not involve ejaculation
- Climax may be less forceful
- Less volume of ejaculate
- Increased refractory period

#### Women

- Slowed/reduced vaginal lubrication
- Thinning of the vaginal tissue
- Shortening of the vaginal canal
- Labia and clitoris are less engorged with blood during arousal
- Perceived orgasmic intensity may decline

Pregnancy prevention.





#### STIs and Older Adults

#### Age does not protect you from STIs

- Rates of STIs (chlamydia, gonorrhea, syphilis) & HIV have doubled for older adults in the past decade
- Lowest rates of condom use is among adults 45+
- Safe sex awareness among older adults & promotion by health care providers is lacking

ONLY 23% OF SEXUALLY ACTIVE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS HAVE BEEN TESTED FOR HIV

1000 NEW HIV CASES AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE EVERY MONTH.




# Do you know how to be safe?
