"Changing social roles in the context of emerging adulthood"

Dr. Kayla Reed-Fitzke is an assistant professor of Couple and Family Therapy at the University of Iowa and a licensed marriage and family therapist. Her research focuses on promoting health and well-being during emerging adulthood by examining intersections of risk and resilience to identify points of prevention and intervention. A primary emphasis on her research is on the role of the family as a source of protection or vulnerability. She was the Project Co-Manager of the Emerging Adult Healthy Relationships Study (2013-2016), and is the current Co-Chair for the NCFR Military Families and Children Focus Group.
